30 (a) Any indemnity under these Conditions shall extend to all actions, proceedings costs, expenses, claims and demands whatever incurred or suffered by the person entitled to the benefit of the indemnity. CONDITIONS MAINLY CONCERNING BUYERS

1 The buyer
